Learning architecture

In Totara Learn you can deliver your learning in a range of ways to suit your organisational requirements, and the needs of your learners. It is important to model an effective learning architecture from the beginning that also takes these needs into account. You will need to ensure the right balance of resources and activities, utilising the many features in Totara such as [courses](#), [programs](#), and [certifications](#).

Courses act as a container for a single strand of learning, whereas **programs** allow you to weave multiple strands together to create a bigger picture. Within a program or a course you might have certain required and optional aspects to aid the learner's journey. **Certifications** are useful for repeating units of study, where you may require learners to recertify at specific intervals. You may find you need to use all or some of these features, along with many others, to create your ideal learning architecture.

As this is a very tailored process that will vary by organisation, it is hard to offer any overarching advice. Instead it is recommend that you discuss any specific needs with your Totara partner.
