

# WebDAV

After enabling a Site Administrator has [enabled the WebDAV repository](#) and [configure the relevant settings](#) you can add an instance to a course and/or user on your site.

## Adding a course repository

Before you can add an WebDAV repository to a course a Site Administrator will need to enable the repository and turn on the **Allow users to add a repository instance into the course** setting. See the [repositories](#) page for more guidance on enabling and settings.

1. Go to the course you wish to add a repository to.
2. In the **Administration** block click **Repositories**.
3. Click the link **Create "WebDAV repository" instance**.
4. Configure the [settings](#).
5. Click **Save**.

## Adding a user repository

Before you can add an WebDAV repository to a user a Site Administrator will need to enable the repository and turn on the **Allow users to add a repository instance into the user context** setting. See the [repositories](#) page for more guidance on enabling and settings.

1. Go to the [Preferences](#) pages for the user you want to add the repository for.
2. Under **Repositories** click **Manage instances**.
3. Click the link **Create "WebDAV repository" instance**.
4. Configure the [settings](#).
5. Click **Save**.

## Settings

Settings	Description	Notes
<b>Name</b>	You can give the instance a name.	-
<b>WebDAV type</b>	Choose from either <b>HTTP</b> or <b>HTTPS</b> .	-
<b>WebDAV server</b>	The name of the server with WebDAV.	-
<b>WebDAV path</b>	The path for the WebDAV directory.	-
<b>Authentication</b>	Set this as HTTP Basic Authentication.	-
<b>WebDAV server port</b>	Enter the webDAV server port.	-
<b>WebDAV server user</b>	The HTTP Basic Authentication username.	-
<b>WebDAV server password</b>	The HTTP Basic Authentication password.	-

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
